

34 minutes from Peterborough


54 minutes from Norwich

There is a **Stained Glass** Museum at Elv Cathedral. It is the only one of its kind in the UK. and is located in the South Triforium. It exhibits over 100 items of some of the most beautiful glass dating from the 13th century to the present day. The shop has a selection of wonderful books, cards and many hand-made glass items.

There is a separate charge to visit the museum.



A visit to Ely Cathedral would not be complete without a tour of our celebrated towers. Tours are subject to weather conditions and Cathedral services. The maximum number of people per tour is twelve and children must be ten years old or over. A reasonable level of fitness is required to climb to the top, so it is not advisable

for anyone in poor health.

Octagon Tower



Ely's famous Octagon, known as a wonder of medieval engineering. is described as nothing less than a masterpiece. Our guided tour will take you back to the time of King Edward III and inside his Master Carpenter's oak Lantern Tower, which enthralls all our visitors by its size and skilful design.





West Tower

At 215 feet (65.5m) high, the West Tower of Ely Cathedral dates from the 13th and 14th centuries and dominates the Fenland landscape. The view from the top is spectacular and well worth the climb.



MONASTIC BUILDINGS

Ely's Monastic Buildings are some of the oldest inhabited buildings in the country. Still in existence are the Prior's House with its vaulted undercroft, and the central part of the Infirmary complex. By the end of the 13th century, the Cathedral and its monastic buildings were largely complete, and included the Almonry which is now a tea room &



Not only is Ely Cathedral located in the centre of this beautiful city, it is also surrounded by parkland and meadows. The Dean's Meadow and Cherry Hill Park will take you from the Cathedral down to the picturesque riverside. The surrounding gardens, lawns and parks make ideal spots for a picnic or somewhere to sit and enjoy the spectacular views.
